UK Explorers

Why Is London Our Capital City?

Paddington has arrived in Y1. He has travelled all the way from Peru to live in the UK and needs the help of the Y1 pupils to find out all he can about his new home in the UK and its capital city – London. Together, we are UK Explorering the environments of UK, answering the question: What makes London our capital city?

Our exploration as explorers begins by using Google Earth to retrieve the information we about where we live, Waddington. Using the zoom out tool on Google Earth, we explore the location of Waddington on the outskirts of Lincoln and then onto where Lincoln lies in the UK, also looking at where Paddington has come from in relation to the UK. As geographers, we use maps to lead us to to discover the four countries of the UK and the surrounding bodies of water. Before locating the capital cities of the UK, we zoom back into the UK map to Waddington, Skegness and Lincoln to identify the differences and similarities of a village, a town and a city using key vocabulary . Using this knowledge, we then discover capital cities of the UK, using symbols to locate them on the map of UK. After making observations through ariel photographs we discover what human and physical feature are. We then show Paddington some of the human and physical features of Cardiff, Edinburgh and Belfast before moving onto describing to him the key features of London. After this, we compare these features to the physical and human features of Lincoln and their diversity.

Activation

Our learning is activated by becoming cartographers, explorers our world by using Google Earth., embarking on our journey of UK Explorers through the character Paddington Bear.

Authentic Outcome As Geographers, Year 1 will apply their knowledge and understanding, demonstrating how they are working as tour guides in creating a tourist suitcase for Paddington.

- using capital letters and full stops
- using `and' to join our sentences
- sequencing our sentences

Poetry

Poetry helps develop communication and language, as well as developing our listening.

As Authors, we will engage with and listen to a range of poems and write narrative poetry of our own.

Maths

Working as mathematicians, building on early skills.

- Numbers 0-20: use umber lines, identify quantity in a representation, explore odd and even numbers and use knowledge of addition and subtraction facts.
- Unitising and coin recognition: counting in groups of two, ten and five, understand the value of 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p and calculate total values.
- Position and Direction: including whole, half and three quarter turns, using directional language.
- Time: sequencing events in chronological order, using language relating to dates, telling the time ti the hour and half past the hour.



We are following the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Programme which focuses on building a strong foundation in phonics, which is crucial for decoding words and becoming a fluent reader.
