# Unddington Primary School Summer in Reception

## Summer One I wonder what is out there...

What has 6 legs and spots?

Our exploration begins by looking at our local environment and what we have around us. Our first stop is minibeasts, exploring what lives in the environment, finding out facts, going on minibeast hunts and learning more about the habitats that they live in.

We then take our learning about habitats further afield, where we look at animals in our local environment and beyond in the wider world, demonstrating our curiosity of animals more broadly.

We will become explorers of jungles, deserts and oceans!

As part of our 'I wonder what is out there' focus we will also develop our People, Culture and Community knowledge by exploring similarities and differences between our lives and the lives of children all over the world. We will look in non-fiction books, at maps, globes and photos to deepen our exploration of people, houses and buildings all over the world, including landmarks.

# Summer Two I wonder what happens next...

Once upon a time...

In Summer two we take our exploration to fiction books! This year we have loved developing our love of reading and learning about different authors and reading a range of high quality texts. We will explore a range of fairytales and traditional tales, delving into life in the past as shown in the stories and really demonstrating our expert knowledge of books we have read through opportunities to retell stories.

We will then become authors, to write stories in our own words and also make our own fairy tales too!

As part of our indoor and outdoor provision, we will be designing and making potions, exploring fairy gardens and making props to retell stories.

Our fairytale learning extends to castles and fantasy lands, where we will look at real life castles and those in fairytale stories, also dipping into people who may have lived in castles in the past.

# English

#### Authors

We have loved learning what authors do and we will continue to read books by our favourite authors, Julia Donaldson, Eric Carle and Rachel Bright.

#### Comprehension

This half term we will explore a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, to develop our understanding of what is being read and to answer how and why questions linked to the text.

We will make predictions based on what has been read and retell stories in a range of scenarios.

#### **Word Reading**

Through our phonics, we will learn how to read words with phase 4 consonant blends, longer words, words with different endings and even more trick words.

We will use this in our reading sessions, to blend to read longer sentences, adding prosody to our voice.

#### Writing

We will have access to a range of writing resources across the Reception areas, to develop our love for writing and independence.
We will focus on writing simple sentences, using a capital letter at the beginning, spaces between words and full stops.

Each morning, the children access the poetry basket, exploring and reciting a range of poems, including:

# Maths

Working as mathematicians, we will:

- Explore doubling and sharing facts
- Subitise to 5 and beyond, in a variety of arrangements
- Count confidently, including organising sets of larger resources for accuracy.
- Add and subtract, linking knowledge to number bonds within 5 and 10.
- Look at patterns within the number system.

We will speak like mathematicians using the correct vocabulary to explain our thinking and understanding. We will demonstrate our mathematical knowledge and understanding through using resources, drawing and writing number sentences too!

#### PSED and Executive Functioning

We will become experts at talking about our feelings and knowing what strategies we can use to help us regulate when we are feeling different emotions. We will have opportunities to demonstrate kindness to our friends and peers and will take turns, share and think about others in our learning environment. We will take part in new learning opportunities, set and work towards our own goals and initiate our own learning challenges.

#### Transition to Year One

During the summer term, we will have lots of conversations about being 'Year One Ready' and will have opportunities to explore the Year One area, get to know the adults and prepare for our transition.
