Mrs Smith's Cottage A Window into the Past

As historians, we begin in developing our understanding of time and how a timeline can be used to learn about events that happened before the present and in the past, understanding the difference between within living memory and beyond living memory. We travel back in decades, learning that we can speak to people to find out about the past within living memory, but we need to use sources, when exploring life beyond living memory.

We develop our understanding of significance. As historians, we explore reasons for why people might be significant to us, our community and everyone around us. This leads us to exploring a significant person in our local area, Mrs Smith, who lived in Navenby in her cottage. As Historians, we are set the task on answering the question:

How will we remember Mrs Smith?

How will we remember Mrs Smith's Cottage?

Anddington Primary School Autumn in Year 1 History We begin our journey discovering who Mrs Smith was, using a timeline to order events in her life. We talk like historians and discuss which facts within the story are significant. Mrs Smith was alive during the reign of two queens. Using a range of sources- photographs, books and film, we explore the lives of Queen Victoria and queen Elizabeth, identifying why these two monarchs were significant and the impact this may have had on Mrs Smith and her life in her cottage.

We explore changes in homes, from the past to present, in the last 100 years, in order to explain changes and similarities from Mrs Smith's cottage to homes in the last 100 years. We then travel further back in time to the Victorian times. Here we learn to be historians by reading photographs to understand what homes were like in Victorian times, so that we have the understanding to help us identify why Mrs Smith's Cottage is remembered today.

Taking a tour of Mrs Smith's cottage through a digital camera, we identify artefacts from the Victorian era around her home, painting a picture of how she lived life.

We look at artefacts from the past to learn what life may have been like for Mrs Smith, exploring another room in her cottage- the laundry room! There are other objects in Mrs Smith's cottage that were not from Victorian times. We take another tour of the cottage, this time identifying what is different in her cottage to a Victorian home. We use a timeline to order key inventions that she used in her cottage, identifying how household items have changed from the past to the present.

Finally, we ask questions to help us interview people who may have known Mrs Smith and why the local people of Navenby still remember her today. We listen to stories and real-life accounts about Mrs Smith to answer our questions.

Poetry

Early Reading

In year 1 we continue the Little Wandle learning. The children are taught phonics daily and they read Little Wandle texts three times a week to build their fluency.

Each week we focus on decoding, prosody and comprehension.

Maths
